Party Identification



- Most people identify with one of the major political parties early in life
 Republican v. Democrat
- Loyalty to a party is the single most significant predictor of how a person will vote. A "shortcut" for ideology and positions on specific issues.
 - Conservatives tend to vote Republican
 - Liberals tend to vote Democratic
 - A growing % of the population identifies now as "Independent"
 - · Many independents "lean" left or right.

- Region
- Education
- Income
- Race
- Occupation




Long-standing gender gap in presidential voting

% who voted for the Democratic candidate




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

Showing presidential vote intention among registered voters






Our model is mostly based on state polls, but national polls inform various steps of its calculations, such as the trend line adjustment, house effects adjustment and demographic regression

Voter Turnout

Factors that influence voter turnout:

Demographics!

PLUS:

- Election Interest (candidates, issues, etc)
- Election type (president, state, local)
- Efficacy (the belief that your vote matters)
- Attitude towards government
